- The Canadian Association of Disability Service Providers in Post-Secondary Education (CADSPPE), a division of the Canadian Association of College and University Student Services, recently conducted a Universal Design Project and published its [bibliography](#). As part of the project, CADSPPE identified a number of online resources, which are mostly American organizations or university research centres with a focus on Universal Design.
- The University of Connecticut features its project, Universal Design for Instruction in Postsecondary Education, on the web page of its Centre on Postsecondary Education and Disability.
- The University of Arkansas at Little Rock has a project called [PACE](#), which focuses on universal design in education and provides links to numerous online resources.
- The University of Toronto at Scarborough published [Universal Instructional Design: Creating An Accessible Curriculum](#) through its AccessAbility Services and Teaching and Learning Services departments in 2004. This work has been cited as “potentially positive practices in post-secondary institutions in Canada” for supporting students with mental health disabilities and reducing stigma (MacKean, 2011, p. 32).
